**Suggestion:** Based on the audit, here are some suggestions for improvement:

2. **Research Grants:** The department should actively seek and apply for various research grants. This could provide additional resources for research and development activities, and foster a stronger research culture.
3. **E-Governance:** Implementing e-governance or ERP in all academic and administrative sectors could streamline operations and improve efficiency. It could also enhance transparency and accountability.
4. **Infrastructure Augmentation:** Regularly assess and update the infrastructure as needed. This could include updating lab equipment, enhancing ICT-enabled facilities, or improving library resources.
5. **Alumni Association:** Establishing a registered and functional alumni association could provide valuable networking opportunities for current students and keep alumni engaged with the institution.

Remember, continuous improvement is key to maintaining excellence in education. These suggestions aim to build upon the already strong foundation of the institution.

### Observations:

Based on the audit report, here are my observations:

1. **Curriculum Aspect:** The institution has a well-planned academic calendar and a curriculum that aligns with the Programme Outcomes (PO) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO). The



focus on employability, skill development, and entrepreneurship is commendable. However, stakeholder feedback for syllabus design and review could be improved.

2. **Teaching Learning and Evaluation:** The institution employs student-centric methods and ICT-enabled teaching, which is excellent. The student-teacher ratio is also satisfactory. However, the mechanism of internal assessment could be more transparent and robust.
3. **Research & Development:** While workshops and seminars on research methodology and skill development are regularly conducted, the institution could benefit from more grants for research projects. The establishment of an innovation and startup cell could also be considered.
4. **Student Support and Progression:** The institution provides excellent support to students through scholarships, career counseling, and guidance for competitive examinations. However, the institution could benefit from a registered and functional alumni association.
5. **Grievance Redressal and Management:** The institution has a good system for addressing grievances related to teaching-learning and examination. However, the implementation of e-governance in all academic and administrative sectors could improve the smooth running of activities.
6. **Institutional Values and Best Practices:** The institution promotes gender equity and observes national and international commemorative days. However, facilities for alternate sources of energy and waste management could be improved.

Overall, the institution has many strengths but there are also areas for improvement to ensure continuous growth and development.
